Press Invited to Attend the Awarding of Investment Funds to High-Tech Company

The Board of Directors of the Arkansas Science & Technology Authority has approved Seed Capital Investment funding for American Fiber Industries, LLC, a Little Rock-based company owned and operated by Mr. Ahmad Hbouss and Mr. Saad Taha. Investment funding provided by the Authority will help support the commercial development of bottle cap enclosures that are manufactured using a more economical plastic material and based on an innovative design and manufacturing process. These cap enclosures will be used on bottles of natural spring water sold and distributed throughout the world by one of the sector's leading manufacturers.

Mr. Hbouss and Mr. Taha have extended an invitation to all of those who have provided assistance and support to the Company. They have also expressed an interest in meeting with several public officials and private sector individuals to affirm their commitment to the State of Arkansas and Little Rock area.
